LAID OFF DUE TO WORK CLOSURES Have you applied for EI?

Yes

- Canadians who have already applied for EI and whose application has not yet been processed would not need to reapply for the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB) as their application will be rolled over
- Canadians who are already receiving EI Regular Benefits as of April 6, 2020, would continue to receive their benefits and should not apply to receive the CERB
- If/when the EI
 Regular Benefits end,
 they can then apply
 for the CERB

No

- You can apply for the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB) which provides payment to workers who are unemployed equal to \$2,000 a month for the next four months (to October 3, 2020)
- Applications will be available in early April through CRA
- After four months, the CERB payments will stop, but eligible individuals will be switched-over to standard El if they are still out of work
- Note: you must be at least 15 years of age and have made at least \$5000 in 2019 or in the last 12 months for CERB

UNABLE TO WORK DUE TO QUARANTINE OF YOURSELF OR A FAMILY MEMBER Have you applied for EI?

Yes

- Canadians who have already applied for EI and whose application has <u>not</u> yet been processed do <u>not</u> need to reapply for the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB) as their application will be rolled over
- Canadians who are already receiving El Sickness Benefits as of April 6, 2020, would continue to receive their benefits and should not apply to receive the CERB Benefit.
- If the El Sickness
 Benefits end, however,
 they can then apply for
 the CERB

No

- You can apply for the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB) which provides individuals with \$2,000 a month for the next four months (to October 3, 2020)
- Applications will be available in early April through CRA

UNABLE TO WORK DUE TO SCHOOL / DAYCARE CLOSURE

- Parents with children who require care due to school/daycare closure and who do not qualify for EI will be able to apply for the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB)
- Individuals will receive \$2,000 a month for the next four months (to October 3, 2020)
- Applications will be available in early
 April through CRA



Employees are encouraged to determine their own eligibility by applying as soon as possible.
